

So, how are we doin'? ...

I was at a meeting today with others from the Diocese involved/interested in the liturgical life of our church. Part of our conversation was centered around the revised Roman Missal and the G.I.R.M. (General Instruction of the Roman Missal). We were asking ourselves how we felt things were going since this had been implemented some six weeks ago.

The majority of us shared that we were "pleasantly surprised". We anticipated quite a learning curve and call for patience with some of what the G.I.R.M. required. Change always comes with some discomfort doesn't it? Considering what it could have been though, it has not been as painful as we thought!

What about you? How do you feel it's going? What are you noticing about your participation in the Mass ... is having to learn new responses helping you to pay more attention to what you're saying? ... Are the bows that we make at the consecration and when we receive communion bringing more of a sense of respect and significance to these moments in the Mass? ... What about the more intentional periods of silence ... before Mass begins ... does this help you to make space for what we are about to celebrate? ... Before the First Reading ... does this help you to prepare a place in your heart to hear God's Word spoken to you? ... after all have received Communion? ... does this give you time to pray in thanksgiving for the gift you have just received? ... And a posture that perhaps has been a challenge to some, standing until all have received Communion ... has this helped you to enter into this ritual of coming to the table conscious of your sisters and brothers and being in communion with others? ...

What have you noticed within you? ... about our experience as a church community celebrating Eucharist? ... Are there any new implementations that are still asking for your patience, for your openness? ...

Let us continue to pray for our presiders in their work to make of these changes a prayer. Let us continue to pray for our parishioners involved in the various liturgical ministries affected by these changes. And let us continue to pray for one another in this time of transition, trusting that God is at work in it all.

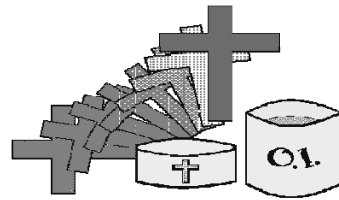

COMMUNAL CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK

It is important that those who are sick and those around them understand the significance of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick as a **sacrament of healing**.

Who should celebrate this sacrament?

- ▶ Those who are elderly and whose frailty is becoming more pronounced
- ▶ Those adults and children who are suffering from a major illness. Illness comes in many different forms - physical, mental, psychological, emotional, and spiritual
- ▶ Those who are facing or recovering from surgery or serious medical tests
- ▶ Those suffering from a serious accident
- ▶ Those who suffer from chronic illness such as arthritis or diabetes
- ▶ Those who care for the sick, especially those who are closely bound in love to them. The English churches of the Diocese of Moncton work together to offer this communal celebration two or three times a year.

Join us on Thursday, February 9th at 9:30 a.m. for mass and the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick to be held at St. Bernard's Church, 43 Botsford Street. Everyone is invited and encouraged to participate in this celebration.

DEVELOPMENT AND PEACE: Aid to the Philippines

Development and Peace has already sent \$50,000 for humanitarian services to the Philippines, an area devastated by floods and mudslides following the Typhoon Washi last December. Local authorities report that floods and mudslides have affected 640,000 residents out of which some 300,000 are still in makeshift shelters. Tropical storms are uncommon in this region of the Philippines and the population was not prepared to face the disaster which caused more than 1,000 victims.
